## From Aafke in Somerset West

From Aafke at the Somerset West Branch

A new customer, Karla Cilliers, sent a request for porcelain paperclay. As the paper we currently use in our paperclay would alter the white colour of our porcelain, we do not as yet offer a porcelain paperclay for sale. Karla then requested advice on amounts of paper to mix together with the clay and advice on wedging the fibre into the clay.

I sent her the following: "The general

rule for paperclay is a 50:50 mixture of paperpulp & clay, however, the quantity that is right for you depends on what you are doing. If you are carving into it, for example, less paper would be better, & if you were making large sculptures more paper might be recommended. The best would be to search the internet, eg. http://www.ccpottery.com/paper.html, for advice or to have a look at one or two books, eg. "Paperclay" by Rosette Gault. You might find it easier to dry the clay out before mixing in the fibre, rather than wedging it in. You might also find that the fibre paper we sell might colour the clay, i.e. it might not be as white as before. Cotton wool or toilet paper might be better for porcelain clay."

Karla spent a lot of time on the internet researching her questions and what I loved (and this is rare!) is that she then shared with me what she had found out, and agreed that I could share this with you:

"1 newsprint ink should not colour the final product, as it burns away 2 cotton lint(er?) is still the most preferred fibre, as it rots more slowly. Toilet paper may contain cornflour, as softener - which is loved by bacteria. Ceiling insulation fibre is treated with flame retardant chemicals, which influences the baking properties. 3 most people seem to use a 1:4 ratio of clay and fibre, although there is definite scope for experimentation"

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all those customers out there who DO take the time to share what they discover with us, and allow us to pass the information onto others.






