Power outages are affecting everyone and causing anything from annoyance to chaos and a resolution doesn't seem any nearer. Planning for the (hopefully large) influx of 2010 tourists should begin now and not left too late. What may or may not sell? What condition are your moulds in? Is your kiln too small to handle any large repeat orders? Do you have sufficient drying space? Are the outlets that sell your pots/sculptures doing the job or should you be looking at alternatives?

Due to the nature of our business the sourcing and availability of raw materials changes very often – see elsewhere in the Chatter news on clay and slip changes/ improvements. We are continuously looking at new products and extending our colour ranges so do pop into our showrooms on a regular basis to come and have a look and discuss your needs.

Glazes that have an overload of colouring oxides can be used to good effect on decorative and sculptural pieces. One such glaze, firing between 1200- 1260 °C has a bronze appearance and is made from 12 parts red clay, 76 parts manganese dioxide, 13 parts copper, mixed with stain binder to help it adhere to the pot. Such glazes are very fluid and you must protect your shelves from runs. Do not apply them to domestic ware, because the extreme quantity of oxides can seep into food during use.

HINTS & TIPS

Tired of pieces collapsing on you when coil building? Here is a tip to make your life a little easier.

When you are busy coiling and you suspect that the piece is getting too wet – STOP.

Cover the top of the rim of the piece with a strip of plastic. Lay one half of the plastic on the outside of the rim about 3 –4 cm down – plastic will stick to the wet clay. Then proceed to fold the plastic over the rim to the inside – all the time making sure that it adheres to the wet clay. The inside must be about the same

width as the outside.

This will stop the rim from drying out, leave the rest of the piece uncovered to dry out slightly and stiffen. Take care not to dry the bottom of your piece too much only enough that it becomes leather hard.

Remove the plastic strip and carry on building. Repeat this process until you have completed your piece. If you plan to be building over a few days just remember to check the piece in the morning. If a little wobbly – cover the rim and give the bottom a chance to stiffen before carrying on.

From Craig's desk

As potters we are currently being challenged by the power cuts and possible penalties for using large quantities of energy.

For clients who have our Model 3 controller with the rectangular LED's we have good news. This controller can be set to restart through the entire firing schedule. It is configured to not restart above 250°C. Should you wish to change to full restart, then by referring to page 9 – OEM Settings of the manual, Item 8, it is possible to set the controller to restart as described above. If you have lost this manual please feel free to contact us.

The downside occurs when a firing is interrupted just before the end of the firing cycle on a glaze firing. It is possible that by re-firing and the temperature drops by 100℃ one would do virtually double the heat work on the glazes. This could result in the appearance of over-fired glazes.

In order to estimate what a firing would cost you, use the following formula:

Multiply the kilowatt (kW) rating of your kiln by the current rate per kW in your area (approximately 40 cents today), and multiply by 60% of the firing time (typically a 10 hour firing using full power).

So in our case an 8 cubic foot kiln is rated at 10kW over a 10 hour firing therefore

10 kw x 10 hrs x 0,60 time x 0,40 cents = R24.00 and you would have used approximately 60 kW of energy.
