From Greg in Montague Gardens Branch

Warm winter greetings from CPS Montague Gardens. So you've been hard at work over the summer months and hopefully all this has paid off. Time to think about a new range, trying somehow to get rid of those pieces that didn't move or just updating or creating your own website. Here are suggestions to help you take great pictures of your pottery with good lighting that defines three dimensional form and shows vibrant colours.

Move a table close to a window. To make the light coming in from the outside easier to work with it's a good idea to tape a piece of tracing paper to the web: <u>www.capepotterysupplies.co.za</u> E-MAIL: <u>info@capepotterysupplies.co.za</u>

window. Blocking some of the light helps give dimension to the pot. Put a piece of black cardboard on one side of the product. (Use black cardboard, as any other colour will reflect some light back and change the colours of your product). To put light in the front of the pot put a piece of white cardboard on the other side. Light coming in from the window will reflect on the white cardboard, brightening the front. The black cardboard will make the other side darker. Diverse tones help better define the pot's three dimensional form. The closer you put the cardboard to the pot, the larger the effect it will have in making the pot darker, or lighter. Place pieces of cardboard as close as you can to the pot but leave enough space to be able to move the camera around. Now you are ready to take those professional pictures! When photographing a glossy object you may get areas that are very bright. Sometimes these bright areas help give a feeling of what a glossy object looks like, and at other times these highlights just blot out detail that you would like to show. The tracing paper softens the light coming in from the window, but to avoid highlights we need to use an even softer light. Take out the black piece of cardboard so as to be able to take a picture from that angle instead. This kind of light creates less highlights and less shadows. However, like everything else in life there is a trade-off. Soft light makes things look flat and colours dull.

Looking forward to seeing some of your pictures.

Before I forget, many of you tried and liked using the Gare "White Bead" glaze before it went out of production. We now have the Amaco version called "White Pebble" in a slightly bigger container at a very reasonable price. Pebble has a pebbly appearance as it breaks up into a pattern resembling pearl tapioca after firing. The break up is dependent upon the application. Pebble can be used under, over or between other glazes for varied and interesting effects.

WORKSHOPS COMING UP AT THE SOMERSET WEST BRANCH

Colourful Clay

Learn how to:

- form a hump mould;
- stain clay;
- incorporate decorative patterns into the clay form;
- mix different clays together in one clay form

Glazing

Learn everything you wanted to know about glazing your own work. Elsabe Nel-Harries will show you how to mix up glaze, as well as taking you through the processes of dipping, pouring and brushing-on the glaze and layering glazes.

Bring along a mug and a bowl – both stoneware, bisque fired. You will be using some of the vibrant Living Colour glazes to decorate your items. We will then fire these to 1200°C for you.

Come with lots of questions – the only silly question is the one that doesn't get asked!

The course is a 2 ½ hour workshop that will run on Wednesday 31 August 2011. Cost: R150-00.

Firing

Learn everything you wanted to know about firing a kiln. Elsabe Nel-Harries will guide you through the process of packing a kiln, as well as explaining the firing process.

Questions are welcomed – there is no such thing as a silly question!

The course is a 2 ½ hour workshop that will run on Wednesday 7th September 2011.

Cost: R150-00.

Painting Techniques

Using the theme of Butterflies & Flowers, learn various painting techniques in decorating a bowl with Chrysanthos onestrokes and Claybright underglaze. Learn how make the most of various types and sizes of brushes. Learn how to shade and to work with colour.

The bowl will be glazed in our **NEW Transparent Matt glaze** (cone 5/1200C) for a subtle finish.

Take home a set of 10 x Claybright underglazes and a set of 6 brushes as well as your finished piece.

Included in the cost is your bowl, one stroke underglazes to use, glaze and firing.

Print your own Transfers

Using transfer paper and a computer (and possibly a fax machine), learn how to print your own sepia-toned transfers, and then learn how to apply them correctly onto a glazed ceramic surface. Decorate your own pasta bowl.

Date: 28th September 2011.

Cost: R 200-00.

BLOCK PRINTS - ONTO TRANSFER PAPER

You will be carving into a block of clay, printing onto transfer paper in progressive images, which is then finally transferred onto a glazed article.

Block Printing

Block Printing is a technique used to print text, images or patterns. The technique is used widely throughout East Asia and is believed to originate in China as a method of printing textiles and later on paper and now onto ceramics.

In block printing the areas to show white in the final print are cut away, leaving the image to show black at the original surface level. The image prints as a mirror-image.

Multiple blocks are used for block printing in colour; a block for each colour. Overprinting two colours can also produce a further range of colours.

We'll supply the clay, transfer paper, cover coat, glazed plate and onglazes

You get to take home: brush, 5 piece sculpture set, modeling tool and your finished piece!

Date: Wednesdays 12 & 19th October 2011.

Cost: R 245.00 per day.

PRINTED BOXES

We are re-running this popular workshop where Elsabe will show you how to transfer images from Photostats onto a box slab-built by you. You get to take home your piece, a palette knife, a set of plastic modelling knives and a scraper.

Please bring:

Photostats of patterns/images to cover a lidded box of which each side is about 12cm x 12cm.

Other materials and tools provided.

A two-day workshop Wednesday 26 October 2011 and Wednesday 2 November 2011.

NCQ – number 96, Winter 2011 features an article in the Technical Forum: Kiln Control by Prof Oelof Heckroodt. Please read it!

Firing cost barometer: Take the kW rating of your kiln x R 7.20. i.e. 10 kw x R 7.2 = R 72.00

Most craft kilns are in the range of 5-10kW at most.

This is an indicative cost only based on a 10 hour firing.

Energy Savings: use FIRELITE shelves – they're 20 % lighter therefore cheaper to fire!
