Many of you will now be preparing for the holidays. So whether you're getting ready for the craft markets, thinking of gifts or simply keeping the kids occupied, we have a large variety of bisque items suitable for painting with non-fired, non-toxic hobby acrylics.

A painting technique that is frequently asked about is the "Dry Brush" technique. So here is a basic rundown of how to go about it:

- Carefully wipe down the bisque item with a damp sponge.
- Using a firm stubby brush as required by the size and shape of the areas you are working on, apply the hobby colour in the following manner.

- Step 1. First, put some colour on the tip only of the brush. Now, scrub most of the colour out of the brush onto a paper towel, moving along the towel so as not to remain in the same area. The brush should have just a tinting of colour.
- Step 2. Apply the remaining colour on the brush in a scrub fashion across the detail of the piece. This will colour the highlights in the detail.
- Step 3. DO NOT wet the brush in water before putting it into the colour. If you must clean the colour out of the brush, dry it before using it again.
- Step 4. If you are using more than one colour in a dry brush technique, always apply the colours on top of one another. Apply the darkest colour first and finish with the lightest colour on top.

HINTS & TIPS

We have a new product on the shelves that will make your life a lot easier!

It is called *STAIN BINDER*. In essence, a clear glue base. This binder can be mixed with your stains or oxides and being "glue" will help to hold the stain on your pot when painted on. It will not smudge which also means that you can now handle your pot when you want to pack it in the kiln or even when you're glazing it. Another advantage is, it creates a very smooth mixture which is easy to paint, almost like underglaze.

This is not all – there are some new stain colours on our shelves – 2 new oranges, a beautiful red and a blue/green stain. Why not give them a try too!




Cones – A relic from Jurassic Park or a valuable potter's tool?

Cones were often referred to as witness cones. Today, in industry, even with sophisticated electronics, they remain in use on a daily basis. For the average potter however, they can be a very valuable diagnostic tool when the results from a firing are abnormal. Cones witness the work done on the glazes for the last 100℃ of firing temperature and the time it takes to complete that 100℃ e.g. a kil n suddenly firing slowly but completes the firing, the wear would appear over-fired and the cones would confirm that. If, however, the glazes or the clay has changed, one may equally get an abnormal firing, but the kiln has fired normally as you would have Again the witness cones would expected it to. confirm this.

It is essential to understand the concept of heat work and time. Temperature achieved is merely one of the variables that leads to the result of firings.

For example, cone 6 will bend at a temperature of 1222° C if the kilns temperature was climbing at 150° C per hour during the last hour of firing. Whereas, the cone would bend at 1243° C if the kiln was firing at 60° C per hour for the last hour. In the latter example, the cone is subjected to more heat

work due to the slower rate of change.
