learned and developed especially in our own country.

I firmly believe that work should entail a lot of fun in order for us to actually enjoy what we do. So here is a fun thing I found to do with wax resist:

Mix liquid wax with oxides and chill them into cubes in an old icetray. When they are firm, grate them with a kitchen grater or low mesh sieve. Add these shavings to your glaze. You can add several different coloured shavings and they will stay separated from each other. The wax pieces will float first, but after a few days can be mixed into the glaze. Now apply your glaze and wait for some unique results!

Some tips on caring for your dipping glaze:

- Store your clear glaze in a cool dry area. Storing it near a kiln or in excessive heat areas can cause evaporation and lead to a thicker glaze.
- Always keep your clear glaze covered when not in use to protect it from dust, contaminants and evaporation.
- Ensure that your bisque is clean, free of oils from hand lotions or food, and free of dust. Accumulated oils and dust can repel glazes, causing bare spots, pin holes and crawling in the fired finish. We recommend wiping your bisque with a damp sponge before applying colour.

From Aafke in Somerset West Branch

Glass batt wash Alumina Calcined local 200# Grog 0.25 – 0.7mm Frit FSB571 Transfers

Our earthenware clays have improved. We are now using a different Kaolin that likes water. The previous one seemed to repel it. Walford China White has also improved in plasticity.

And finally...some tips on Casting Slip:

- It is better to stir the slip slowly as this prevents air bubbles being trapped in the slip.
- Warm slip is better than cold as it pours easier. Cold slip is thicker and can't get into small areas, as well as trapping bubbles
- A good pouring consistency is indicated when a spread hand dipped in slip shows a web on the spread fingers.

10% of fettlings can be added to slip

Glass Batt Wash packaged in 1kg bags is now available at all branches of CPS.

Note: If batt wash (shelf primer) is applied unevenly or bare patches are left, glass may stick to the shelf as it expands during the firing process. When this happens, the glass can pull itself apart and break. Batt wash should be cleaned off and reapplied in a thin even coating to prevent this occurring. Take care not to use too much batt wash as it may require sandblasting to remove it from the bottom of the fired piece!
